**NOTICE OF LAST DAY OF REGISTRATION
FOR SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON
TUESDAY, AUGUST 10, 1993**

A special election for the Farmington Community Library will be held on Tuesday, August 10, 1993. All registered electors residing within the Farmington Community Library District, which consists of the Cities of Farmington and Farmington Hills, are eligible to vote at the special election on the following questions:

**FARMINGTON COMMUNITY LIBRARY
BONDING PROPOSITION**

Shall the Farmington Community Library borrow the sum of not to exceed Fifteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$15,500,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds in one or more series for all or a portion of that amount for the purpose of erecting, furnishing and equipping a new main library building; purchasing, developing, and improving the site for the new building; and making necessary repairs and capital improvements at the branch library in the City of Farmington?

**FARMINGTON COMMUNITY LIBRARY
OPERATING MILLAGE PROPOSITION**

Shall the Farmington Community Library levy taxes against property in the Farmington Community Library District in an amount not to exceed 1.4 mills (\$1.10 on each \$1,000) of state equalized valuation for a period of 20 years in order to provide funds for the purpose of operating the Farmington Community Library?

THE LAST DAY ON WHICH UNREGISTERED PERSONS MAY REGISTER TO VOTE IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE AT THE SPECIAL ELECTION IS:

MONDAY, JULY 12, 1993

Application for registration may be made to the City Clerk of the city of which the elector resides, or any Secretary of State office, or elsewhere as permitted by law. The City Clerk's offices in Farmington and Farmington Hills are open weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. On Monday, July 12, 1993, the last day for registration as stated above, these offices will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Electors who wish to vote in the Special Library Election must be registered to vote no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday, July 12, 1993. Persons who are currently registered need not re-register.

**CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS
CITY COUNCIL PETITIONS**

- Petitions are available at the Office of the City Clerk, 31555 Eleven Mile Road, if you plan to seek one of four seats for councilmember on the Farmington Hills City Council.
- Petitions may be requested from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. All candidates who qualify will be placed on the ballot.
- The deadline for filing nominating petitions is on or before Tuesday, August 24, 1993, by 4:00 p.m. SHARP.
- There is no primary election. Based on the number of votes for each candidate, voters will elect three councilmembers for four-year terms and one for a two-year term on a non-partisan ballot at the General City Election on Tuesday, November 2, 1993.
- Candidates for nomination must meet the following qualifications:
 - Be a duly registered elector of the City of Farmington Hills.
 - Submit nominating petitions signed by at least 125 and not more than 246 qualified registered electors on or before Tuesday, August 24, 1993, by 4:00 p.m. SHARP.
 - Submit two affidavits of identity of candidates filing nominating petitions (available at the City Clerk's Office).
 - Submit an affidavit as to name change (if applicable).
 - Pursuant to Section 3.02(C) of the City Charter, no city employee shall become a candidate for nomination or election to the council.

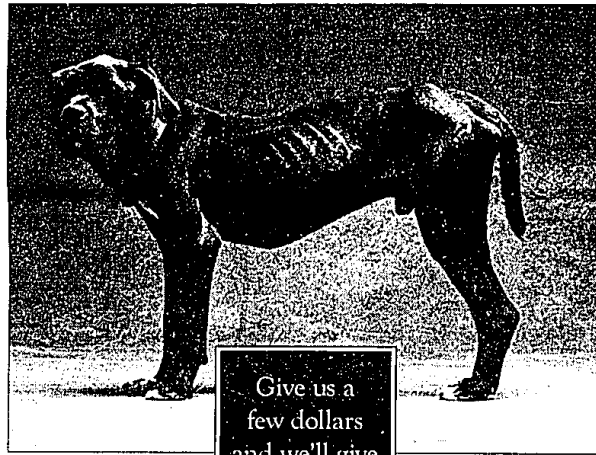
