

# FCC pre-empts start of new rules

The Federal Communications Commission has ordered "deferred implementation" of the cable service rate regulation from June 21, 1993 until Oct. 1. They extended the rate freeze of regulated cable service rates from Aug. 4 to Nov. 15, 1993.

This delay will enable all parties to step back and realistically prepare for the new law. Local franchising authorities, such as the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission, are also delayed for filing certification to regulate the basic service tier of cable service until Oct. 1.

Consumer complaints concerning cable programming will be accepted by the FCC beginning Oct. 1, 1993.

Meanwhile you may continue to first contact MetroVision to answer your questions and resolve your concerns at 553-7300.
