## Caesars wins 8th straight

Hines Park-Lincoln Mercury got out of the gate fast but Little Caesars is gaining ground in the race for the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League regular-season championship.

Caesars ran its winning streak to eight games with Monday's 8-2 win over Westland Federation at Livonia's Ford Field. Caesars, which swept a doubleheader on Friday from Wendy's, improved to 15-8.

Caesars has 30 points, five behind league-leading Hines Park, which began the season with an 18-game unbeaten streak but has slumped to 17-3-1.

Third-place Del-Wal, which was idle over the Fourth of July weekend, is 12-6-1 for 25 points (prior to Wednesday's doubleheader against Walter's Appliances).

Mark D'Antonio scattered seven hits and struck out four in going the distance against Westland to even his pitching record at 3-3. It was the fourth straight complete game performance by a Caesars starter.

Westland's Dan Taylor had the best success against D'Antonio, going three for three. Kevin Craggs singled and scored a run. Caesars had 10 hits off Westland pitchers Bobby Arliano and

The championship game matched the Cubs against Nuckols again, but the Cincinnati team avenged its loss, 13-6. South Farmington pitchers allowed 17 hits, and the Cubs made five errors and stranded 10 runners. Hatch had two hits.

The Cubs, an all-13-year-old team in the 14-and-under Koufax Division, are 12-14 overall. The team is managed by Larry Rospierski and coached by Scott Carson, Jack Falvo and Mike Volain.

## Kleinhardt's Forte racing

In its first year the Detroit BSA/Sailing World National Offshore One-Design Regatta became the largest NOOD Regatta ever held. The series of races, held recently on Lake St. Clair, set an attendance record with 169 boats, eclipsing the old mark of 167 set last year in Chicago.

The fleet was broken into 19 classes, 13 one-design and six level-rating. Because of the large turnout the fleet competed on two separate courses. Wind strengths during the five races varied from under five knots to better than 24 knots.

Those conditions seemed to suit a few area sailors well pretty well. Dr. Sonny Tindle, of Rochester, Michael Goran, of Bloomfield Hills and Tom Kleinhardt, of Farmington Hills were each triumphant in

their respective classes.

Tindle, competing in the Level 40 Class, skippered Asail (N.A. 40) to victory with 8.75 points, 2.5 points better than the second-place finisher.

Goran skippered Dream Machine (X-40) to the top spot in the Level 40 Class with 11.75 points, four points ahead of second place.

In the Catalina 38 Class, Kleinhardt rode Forte (Catalina 38) to victory with 7.25 points, 4 1/2 points ahead of second.
