

Dwyer hopes for speedy arrest in murder case

Farmington Hills Police Chief Bill Dwyer said he is "cautiously optimistic" that the murderer of a 65-year-old Garden City man will be arrested, although he wouldn't speculate on when that would be.

"We have a lot of good physical evidence and we have some suspects," Dwyer said. "Most of the evidence has been processed already by the Michigan State Police crime lab and by our lab."
