■ DONALDSON IMPROVING
The condition of Livonia Clarenceville football coach Chuck Donaldson has been upgraded from critical to fair at the University of Michigan Hospital, where he remains after being involved in a two-car accident last month in Canton, family members said.

Donaldson's sister Debbie Cole said he still can't move his legs but was sitting up in a chair last week. Donaldson was treated for a fracture in his skull, a partially broken neck, broken arm and broken leg, she said.

"Chucky's fantastic, he's sitting up in a chair—I don't think they're going to keep him down," Cole said Thursday night. "He wants a Pepsi in the worst way. He wants to teach again. It's incredible the drive he has. They (doctors) are not counting him out walking again but they're not counting him out not walking again."
