"The Femily," a bronze piece by Charles Balogh of Bloomfield Hills, features human faces and forms embarcing each other, making a smooth circle without beginning or end.

Realism takes on an almost magical air in the hydro-cal "Control" by Rosemary Busch of Farmington, which depicts a straining ethletic form; bronze "Cougar" and "Bull Turning" by Earle Davis, which won first prize and honorable mention, respec-

tively; fired clay "Two Hippos" by Harlan Quinn, which was awarded third prize; and bronze "Calla" by Nikki Van Dine of Huntington Woods.


