

Hills signs 15-year recycling contract

Farmington Hills is taking a sure thing by signing on for a 15-year recycling contract instead of five years.

After considering the two alternatives and discussing them in a study session last month, the city chose the 15-year deal, which will cost residents less per year.

The city can still get out of the contract, without cause, within six months of notifying Waste Management Inc. at any time over the life of the contract.

Farmington Hills is the first of the eight communities in the Resource Recovery and Recycling Authority of Southwest Oakland County to approve a recycling contract.

Waste Management, which won

a bidding process where only one other firm, Ferris Browning Industries, competed, will finance and run a Material Recovery Facility to be built at 2000 W. Eight Mile, Southfield.

Farmington Hills and Southfield, the two largest communities in the authority, must take part in the recycling process for it to run. Southfield has not officially voted on a recycling contract yet.

The contract would cover solid waste, recycling and composting based on a per single family unit per year basis. Under the 15-year contract, the cost for all those services would be \$124.66 with a maximum increase of 3 percent per year. The five-year contract would start at \$127.96 and increase up to 3 percent for five years.
