

Scientific director named by Cancer Foundation

One of the country's leading cancer investigators in experimental chemotherapy of cancer and AIDS has come to Detroit to head Michigan Cancer Foundation's research efforts as scientific director.

Awtar Krishan, formerly scientific director at the University of Miami's Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center, will oversee the Foundation's laboratory and epidemiological research programs.

"It's my job to combine the accomplishments of our research staff with the clinical researchers and physicians at The Detroit Medical Center and other hospitals in the Detroit area," said

Krishan of Farmington Hills. Krishan will hold a joint appointment as associate director of the Hematology/Oncology division in Wayne State University's Department of Medicine.

Among his research specialties are cytometry (which he uses to measure the amount of anti-cancer drug that penetrates tumor cells), chemo-resistance (explaining why tumors are resistant to treatment) and chemotherapy of AIDS.

Krishan said that when it comes to funding promising research, the country's major funding sources see little distinction between cancer and AIDS.

"Many of the drugs used to

treat AIDS patients came out of the cancer program. Also many AIDS patients get tumors, especially Kaposi's sarcoma and lymphomas."

Two of the three drugs approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for use in AIDS — AZT and ddC — were developed at Michigan Cancer Foundation.

Scouts attend national jamboree

Almost 75 Scouts and parents from Boy Scout Troop 179, sponsored by the First Presbyterian Church of Farmington, will travel to the National Scout Jamboree in Virginia Aug. 4-9 to visit the nation's capital and meet 80,000 Scouts from around the world.

Every four years Scouts from throughout the country (and a handful of young visitors from far away nations) raise money for months in advance to travel to this Scouting festival.

Troop 179 will stay in Fredrickburg, Va., where they can both visit the Jamboree and also have access to Washington, D.C., and nearby attractions like Busch Gardens amusement park.

Highlights of the Jamboree itself will include dazzling evening

shows with fireworks, laser light spectacles, and entertainers like country music group Alabama and Up With People of Super Bowl halftime show fame.

President Clinton is expected to make a midweek address to the Scouts, and famous Eagle Scouts such as Steven Spielberg are common sights at National Jamborees.

"Troop 179 began making plans for this trip in 1989 when several of its Scouts attended the most recent Jamboree."

Since that time, the 10-17 year-old Farmington Scouts have saved money for the trip selling holiday wreaths, peddling popcorn, and manning concession stands at the Pontiac Silverdome.

Other community support has come from Ford Motor Co., Chrysler, and GMAC in the form of vans for transportation, and numerous Farmington area businesses and civic groups have given financial support, including

the Farmington Exchange Club, the Optimists Club, the Elks Club, the Korner Barbers, and Plaza Veterinary Hospital.

Even former Troop 179 Scouts, now successful adults living as far away as California, have supported their alma mater troop in their money-raising efforts.

Said Linda Enberg, chair of the troop's community support drive, "It was most inspiring to see so many Farmington and Farmington Hills groups and individuals pour out support for this worthwhile Scouting experience."

Chuck Williams, Scoutmaster of this largest Scout troop in Oakland County, said, "The last time Troop 179 visited a National Jamboree was 20 years ago when I was a boy. I know our Scouts today will enjoy as I did this spectacular event as a highlight in their Scouting memories."

Troop 179 meets every Tuesday from September through June at 7 p.m. in the fellowship hall of the First Presbyterian Church, on Farmington Road and 11 Mile.

As of September 1, 1993 a 4% penalty will be added along with a one-half percent per month interest charge. Payment may also be made at local branches of Michigan National Bank, Comerica Bank, National Bank of Detroit and Metrobank. Payments made at local banks may be subject to an account relationship requirement and/or a processing fee. In addition a depository is available near the Eleven Mile Road entrance to City Hall.

Applications for deferment of 1993 summer taxes are available at the Treasurer's Office. If your income did not exceed \$25,000 and you are a paraplegic, quadriplegic, senior citizen, eligible serviceman, eligible widow, blind or totally or permanently disabled, your application for deferment must be filed with the Treasurer's Office no later than September 14, 1993. Deferred summer taxes may be paid without penalty until February 28, 1994.

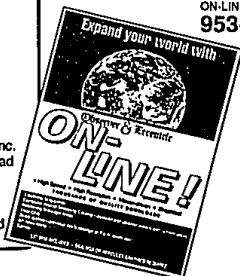
