# Cancer group names scientific director

One of the country's leading cancer investigators in experimental chemotherapy of cancer and AIDS has come to Detroit to head Michigan Cancer foundation's research efforts as scientific director. Awar Krishan, Ph.D., former scientific director at the University of Miami's Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center, will oversee the foundation's laboratory

and epidemiological research programs, focusing on the translation of research from laboratory to clinical settings. Krishan will hold a joint appointment as associate director of the Hematology-Oncology division in Wayne State University's Department of Medicine. Among his research specialties are cytometry (which he uses to measure the amount of an anti-

cancer drug that penetrates tumor cells), chemo-resistance (explaining why tumors are resistant to treatment) and chemotherapy of AIDS. Krishan has also worked with NASA, serving as chairman of the Pharmacodynamics study group for the Space Inflight Cytometry Project. Krishan lives in Farmington Hills.

# Race Relations presents awards

The Race Relations Council of Metropolitan Detroit will present Detroit Principles Awards to area organizations and individuals making major contributions to improving Detroit-area race relations. The conference entitled "Tear Down the Walls: A Call for City-Suburban Reconciliation" is scheduled for Sept. 22. Awards will be made in five categories — governmental, individual, business, community and youth — to recognize those who exemplify the spirit of fairness and justice as put forth in the "Detroit Principles: A Doctrine

For Fairness." The Detroit Principles were developed in 1990 by the Race Relations Council to provide a framework for action around race relations issues. Signers of the Principles pledge work for the establishment of a metropolitan community in which every resident has access to a quality education, a safe neighborhood, good health care, equal employment and quality housing regardless of race, religion or ethnicity. Currently, there are more than 2,000 organizational and individual signers of the Detroit Principles.

Ford Motor Co., an early signer of the document, is the financial sponsor of the September conference. All nominees must live, work or be involved in race relations activities that impact the Detroit metropolitan area. Nominations for awards may be made by any individual or organization that has signed the Detroit Principles.
