

Farmington man elected to Leukemia Society board

Farmington resident Michael D. Isabella, 34, was unanimously elected to the 1993-94 Leukemia Society of America, Michigan Chapter, Board of Trustees.

The position is effective July 1993 through July 1995. Isabella developed the WLLZ Radiothon to Fight Leukemia, which reached national fund-raising records for the Leukemia Society for three consecutive years.

The radiothon raised over \$340,000.

In making the announcement, Leukemia Society executive director Karen Pyle said, "Michael's extensive involvement in raising funds for the society for four years makes him the perfect choice for our board."

A mammogram will detect even the smallest cancer years before you will feel it.

If you're a woman, you're at risk for developing breast cancer. Because most breast cancers occur in women who don't have any identifiable risk factors, mammograms are even more important.

Your risk may also increase as you get older, if you have a family history of breast cancer, if you have never had children or had your first child after age 30.

Early detection through regular mammograms and self examination is your best weapon against breast cancer. A routine screening mammogram has been shown to decrease mortality by breast cancer by 25% in post menopausal patients. The American Cancer Society guidelines suggest that if you're 35 to 40 years old you should schedule a baseline mammogram. If you're 40 to 50 you should schedule a mammogram every one to two years. And if you're over 50, you should have a mammogram every year.

You don't need a doctor's prescription to schedule a mammogram. Botsford's mammography equipment and program is certified by the American College of Radiology and is fully licensed by the Michigan Department of Public Health.
