If convicted of bank fraud, Farbat faces up to 30 years in prison and could be fined up to \$1

"However, the sentence would be imposed under the United States sentencing guidelines, ac-cording to the nature of the of-fense and the criminal record, if any, of the defendant," Weier said.

The FBI investigated the case.
