

# Ex-resident faces fraud charge

A former Farmington Hills resident has been indicted by a federal grand jury in Detroit on the charge of bank fraud.

Jihad Farhat, 31, a former resident of the Mulwood Apartments, was indicted July 21. The indictment charges that Farhat used the name of a former associ-

ate, opened a business checking account at a branch of the NBD bank in Livonia, deposited a series of stolen checks into that account and withdrew the money for his own use, said assistant U.S. attorney Craig A. Weller.

If convicted of bank fraud, Farhat faces up to 30 years in prison and could be fined up to \$1

million.

"However, the sentence would be imposed under the United States sentencing guidelines, according to the nature of the offense and the criminal record, if any, of the defendant," Weller said.

The FBI investigated the case.
