

Police auction to offer chance at ill-gotten gains

Although the inventory is down this year, the Farmington Hills Police Department's annual auction will feature some good buys. The police will auction off everything from bikes to stereo speakers at 11 a.m. Friday at police headquarters at 11 Mile and Orchard Lake roads.

"We made about \$3,600 last year," said city purchasing agent Mike Lasley. "Most of the money goes into the general fund, but some of it has to go into drug forfeiture."

The items auctioned include property that was stolen and re-

covered but never claimed by the owners. Some furniture and other equipment the city no longer needs will also be up for sale.

"There were over 150 people who showed up last year," said Sgt. John Kohls, who runs the auction.

Kohls said anyone interested in taking part can register beginning at 9 a.m. Participants will be given a number for bidding purposes.

"Bikes and jewelry are popular items," Kohls said. "We don't take credit cards, but we do take checks. We think it unlikely that people would write us a bad check."
