

POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**FIRE**
A fire that started in a dryer at a house on Stonegate in Farmington Hills caused about \$6,000 in damage. Farmington Hills firefighters from station 4 put out the fire at about 3:15 p.m. July 23 after a house sitter called in the fire. There was no damage to the house and no injuries. Clothing had ignited in the dryer.

**THEFT**
A woman's cluster diamond ring worth \$2,100 was stolen from a residence at the Muirwood Apartments on Woodridge in Farmington Hills July 21 or 22. Three diamond rings worth a total of \$620 were stolen from Toppan Jewelers on Northwestern Highway in Farmington Hills July 23.

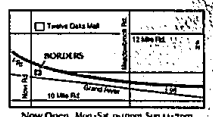
