
CHEVROLET THE HONORED MARQUEE AT THE 1993 TDM MEADOW BROOK HISTORIC RACES

the 15th annual Concours d'Elegance will long be remembered as the year Chevy Thunder rolled across the fairways at Meadow Brook Hall with a magnificent display of vehicles, tracing the history of Chevrolet Motor Division's significant contribution to motorsports history and technology.

Chevrolet Motor Division is the associate sponsor for the ninth annual TDM Meadow Brook Historic Races, which will see a special circle of Chevrolet racing vehicles presented to the spectators in opening ceremonies at Waterford Hills Raceway in nearby Clarkston, Michigan.

A special touring ceremony will feature all of the vehicles selected by Chevrolet for its circle, racers entered in the 1993 Historic Races, and selected Chevrolet performance vehicles, in one gigantic parade. The parade will be over 1.5 miles long around the race course.

As a sponsor of both the 15th annual Meadow Brook Concours d'Elegance and the ninth annual TDM Meadow Brook Historic Races, Chevrolet General Manager Jim Perkins said, "It's a privilege and a pleasure for Chevrolet to be a sponsor in the Meadow Brook Historic Races, where some of our most spectacular cars will be showcased. Our involvement with Concours d'Elegance is timely, since this is the first time that 1932 Chevys will be judged, and the Concours will also provide a continuation of our year-long Corvette 40th anniversary celebration."

From Grand Sport Corvettes to Can Am cars, Chevrolet will be well repre-

sented both on the race track and the Concours field at Meadow Brook.

The Sixth Annual Autometric Historic Race Motorsport Art Show welcomes ten of the pre-eminent motor sports artists of today to a special exhibition and sale at Waterford Hills. The annual John Burgess Award will be presented to the artist who most inspires motorsports competition through art.

At Meadow Brook Hall for the Concours d'Elegance, the vintage race car circle will feature 12 outstanding vehicles in competition for the Peter Helck race car trophy, sponsored by TM Smith Tool Co. The 1953 Tojeiro MG, which boasts an impressive race history, is entered by Gerald and Carol Roush of Lilburn, Georgia, publishers of the Ferrari Market Letter. Their Tojeiro is

one of two built in England to race internationally at the Isle of Man, Nurbuergring, Germany; Zaandvoort, Holland; and a host of events in England.

On April 10, 1954, the Tojeiro, driven by one Stirling Moss, finished third at the British Empire trophy race. This was one of motor racing legend Moss's earliest drives. This vehicle, in recent years, has continued its international travels with appearances at the 1989 Mille Miglia Storica, a 1,000 mile road race in Italy, and the 1991 Highlands classic 1000 km race which saw the Roushs capture first place overall and the Vintage Motorsport Cup.
