## Farmington Hills teen faces stalking charges

A 17-year-old Farmington Hills youth is charged with stalking a former girlfrend and violating a restraining order, stomming from phone calls made this spring. Nikolas Adexandro Rajkovic, 17, is scheduled to sppcar Fridoy
