## Group to parent parents

Farmington Youth Assistance is sponsoring a 10-week parenting course based on Dr. Rudolph Dreikur's book, "Children: The Challenge."

Parent study groups usually consist of 15-18 persons and meet for two-hour sessions weekly for 10 weeks. Chapters from the book and additional supplemental readings are discussed. Parents are taught techniques that encourage children to take responsibility for their own actions.

The emphasis is on parents helping parents. The volunteer leaders are parents who have completed the parenting classes and found the techniques effective in their own homes.

The class starts on Monday, Sept. 13, from 7:30-9:30 p.m. at the Ten Mile School in Farmington. The cost of the course is \$20 for one or \$25 if both parents enroll. The fee includes the book and all supplemental materials.

ments and a contribution.

Feldman said the contribution will not affect her on negotiations or labor issues.

"Absolutely not," she added.

"I will tell you I received a variety of endorsements and contributions and one was by the FEA. The endorsement was made with the money. That's what they offer when they endorse you."

Contributions of \$25 also came from board member Susan Lightner and former board member John Cotton. Board president

Cathleen Webb contributed \$60.10 in the form of labels, name badges and printing.

Feldman also netted \$1,090 in a campaign fund-raiser May 17 at Leo's Coney Island. More than \$1,100 came in the form of a loan she took from herself and repaid.

Other candidates also footed a majority of their campaign bill either directly or through loans to themselves.

EDN Committee received contributions of \$25 from board members Helen Prutow, Lightner and Cotton. He also received \$300 and \$125 contributions from individuals and netted \$600 in a fund-raiser May 24 at A&W.

The rest of York's campaign money came out of his own pocket.

"I think it's attributable to hard work and individual contribution of time and commitment," York said.

Notable contributions to Friends for Susan McKendrick included: Ronald and Cheryl Oliverio, \$100; Richard DeVries, \$50; and Farmington Hills City Council member Terry Sever, \$50. McKendrick also had a fund-raiser May 16 at a private residence that grossed \$750. But \$2,509 came out of her own pocket.

Ditzhazy financed the \$1,523 she spent. She also received \$750 from the Farmington Coordinating Council.

"If I had been elected, I wouldn't have accepted it," said Ditzhazy, who added she's turned down FEA contributions in prior elections. "Since I wasn't, I figured I would... I didn't want to be beholden to any group."

Fobbs received a \$100 contribution from DeVries as well as a \$50 donation in kind for printing costs.

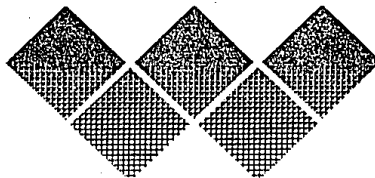
