The goal of the studies is to provide more analytical data about suicide cases, according to Dr. Stanley J. Watson, associate director of the Mental Health Research Institute at the University of Michigan.

Despite the fact that thousands of people take their own lives every year, medical science knows relatively little about the physical characteristics of the brain, he

"We want to look at tissue to determine the condition of the brain and the physiological factors that might have contributed to the decision to take their own professor of psychology.

The victim's next of kin, of course, would be consulted prior to any tests being conducted, the family didn't consent, no tests would occur.

Assuming family members do agree, Watson and interviews would be conducted to help determine the psychological state of the victim. "We'd like to know things like whether he or she was despondent or on medication." Families that cooperate may get some consolation knowing that data obtained after the death of a loved one contributed to medical science and a better understanding of suicide, he said.

Watson said it's difficult to escess a dollar amount to the project. "We've been working on this for some time, so we've already invested some resources. If we started from scratch, however, it would easily cost \$1 million."

The value of information derived could not be measured in dollars. "Any suicide is a tragedy." Waston said. "But the suicide of an adelescent is particularly tragic."
The University of Illinois study would focus on suicide among

people 21 or younger, said Dr. Pandey.
Research on that age group may be particularly helpful, he said, because younger people are less likely to have had long-term health problems requiring medication. The absence of medication may give researchers a botter insight into the physiological conditions.

Oakland County was selected for scholarly studies on suicide for a variety of reasons, according to Dragovic and Watson.

Dr. Kevoikian — the Royal Oak pathologist, sometimes called "Doctor Death," who has become the champion of physican-assisted suicide—is not one of them.

"Kevorklan is not a factor,"
said Dragovic who was a prosecution at least one of the preliminary examinations when Kevorkian was charged with murder. All
of those charges were dismissed
when separate judges ruled them
was no law against assisted suicide in Michigan. Since that time,

Dragovic said it's pure coincidence that Oakland, where Kevorkian admittedly participated in several of his 17 assisted suicides, is the proposed site of extensive medical study on the topic.

"I couldn't in good conscience study the suicide cases of Dr. Kevorkian," said Watson. "That's not a statement on (the legitimacy or illegitimacy or illegitimacy or illegitimacy or illegitimacy) of assisted suicide."

But many of Kevorkian's clients had serious physical problems and had taken medication extensively, he said.

Not only are Oakland's medical personnel competent, asid Watson. 
