"It's our job not to cancel it outright, to say it's no good. Our job is to really test it out."

Constant investigation

The process is time-consuming and costly. The arduous procedure involves constant investigation, weighing effects of those who take the drug against those who receive a placebo.

An investigational new drug (IND) report first has to be filed with the National Cancer Institute. Once a drug is deemed safe, an IND is filed with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

Phase I of the clinical study determines the MTD, the maximum tolerated dose. Phase II involves finding out how effective it is with a tumor.

From there, if the results are favorable, licensing of the drug begins.

The process used to take any drug from 10 to 15 years. Recently, though, some drugs of been FDA approved in two years.

AIDS research and cancer research have gone hand and hand. AZT and DDC, developed 25 years ago by Jerome Horwitz at the Michigan Cancer Foundation, were two of the three drugs OK'd by the FDA for AIDS patients.

Krishan, who also specializes in chemotherapy for AIDS, said everyone has to see the bigger picture when it comes to cancer research.

A human disease

He said breast cancer shouldn't be treated as a female disease, but a human disease. Likewise for prostate cancer, he added, which afflicts men.

"Science should be determined by what the need is, not by who

about the loudest," he said. "I think that's being corrected, though."

Science and opportunity led Krishan to this country in the early 1980s. He studied at the University of Western Ontario in London, coming to Detroit with his school mates occasionally for pizza.

He worked in Minnesota for a year before moving onto Harvard Medical School. He stayed there for 14 years before becoming the scientific director at the University of Miami's Sylvester Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Krishan is staying with his daughter, Dr. Aruna Ganju, a neurosurgeon at Henry Ford Hospital. His wife, Sarita, is a high school English teacher.

Their other daughter is in medical school, and their son attends high school in the Miami area.

Through all the cable television changes all consumers may expect to receive answers to their questions. If you do not get a timely response, the staff of the Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission will be happy to intervene as liaison.

For inquiries which have not been answered to your satisfaction at a local level, contact the FCC General Cable Inquiry telephone number, 1-202-432-0004. Were you to have a complaint to register regarding the new rates you must send the FCC and the cable company and the SWOCC (cable commission) the FCC Complaint Form 329. You may have SWOCC send you the form. Call 473-7266. You may also expect a response within 30 days from the cable company.

Were you to care to have detail of the Community Services provided by SWOCC having resulted from the franchise fee, call 473-7266 to have an information piece sent to you.

The entire jurisdiction is under the Federal Communications

Commission ruling. The local franchising authority, SWOCC, must now apply for certification to regulate the Basic Broadcast Tier Channels 2-23. This authority, however, is still under the rules of the federal law. Once certified the local commission will have the right to scrutinize the basic broadcast rates for reasonable pricing of the services. Rates would then be limited to change no more than annually.

If the FCC were not to accept the local authority to regulate cable rates then the FCC would continue to provide the regulation.

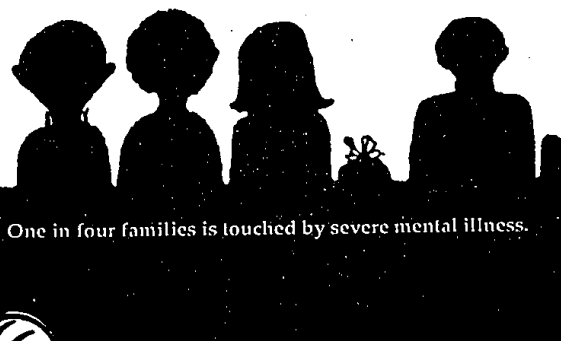
