Used book lovers alert: AAUW's sale starts Saturday

The Birmingham branch of the American Association of University Women's 68th annual used book sale will occur this weekend at the Birmingham Mesonic Temple.

The hours of operation are 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Saturday, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. and 6-8 p.m. Sunday, and 3 a.m. to noon, Monday A. Preview Salo" will occur 6:30-9 p.m. Friday for book buyers who want first dibs. Admission is \$5.

The Masonic Temple is located at 357 Woodward Ave. in Bloomfield Hills.

The early sales were held in store fronts. The Webeek Building was the first. Crowley's was used, as was a Beptist church and the YMCA. In the late 1960s the sale settled in at the Masonic Temple on the west side of Woodward between Quarton and Lone Pine.

The idea behind the book sale is to raise money for college scholarships and community projects. The scholarship money, \$3,000 last year, is divided in half and

given to organizations that pro-vide scholarships for graduates of schools in the Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills school districts.

schools in the Birmingham and Bloomfield Hills school districts. Additional money is given to Maint College for acholarships administered by those schools. Also, the AAUW gives some of the book sale proceeds to community programs and projects. Martha Baur, the AAUW publicity chaliwoman, declined to say which community programs get the donations or how much money the book sales usually raise. This year the AAUW has collected 18,000 to 20,000 items, including records, sheet music and video tapes, Baur said. Last year the organization had \$4,000 items. Baur attributes the drop off to a discerning eye. "We're far more selective than we used to be," she said.

Prices this year are the same as at last year's sale. Paperbacks are 35 cents each or three for \$1. Hardcover books are 80 cents except for a few that are worth a lot of money.






