

HUNTER'S SAFETY
In accordance with Michigan State law, participation is required in a certified hunter's safety clinic for individuals who were born after Dec. 31, 1959, and wish to buy their first hunting license. The course will meet Sept. 27 and 29 and Oct. 16-9 p.m. and Oct. 29 a.m. to noon. Participants must attend all sessions and pass a written test to qualify for the certificate and be 12 by March 31,

1994. Registration fee of \$5 per person is required.

RUN THROUGH THE HILLS
