## Artist creates variety and beauty out of clay

Black and metallic interminglings of raku, highly textured stoneware and delicate percelain document Dobbie Liberman's 10-year love affair with clay.

Through Sept. 29, the South-field ceramist displays a variety of innovative wares in a one-person exhibition hosted by the Livonia Arta Commission in the circular showcases on the second floor of the Livonia Civic Center Library, Farmington Road and Five Mile.

Primarily hand-built with some wheel thrown, Liberman's pottery ranges from whimsical turtle and fish dishes, earrings and lapel plns to exquisitely textured platters. Cactuses and coyotes cover the interior of one bowl while abstract patterns and shapes take form in a wallbang-ing.

"One of the first things that ettracted me to Debbie's work was the designs," said arts commissioner Lee Alanskas, who produces the monthly showcase exhibits.
"It was not the ordinary type of

pottery. Upon closer inspection, I noticed the textures and color. They're quite appealing."
Texture plays on the surfaces of the pottery, creating interesting patterns. Liberman uses everyday items like a meat tenderizer or old items like a meat tenderizer or old lace to decorate the interiors and exteriors. Circular and diamond-shaped cutouts were formed with a kitchen utensil used to cut fancy hors d'ouevres.

By day, Liberman manages the fashion department of Kmart in Taylor but at night she takes pleasure from creating ceramics.

During the 16 years she has worked for Kmart Fashlons, company transfers have taken Liberman away from home for extended periods. When Liberman was transferred to Saginaw 10 years ago, she took a pottery class at Delta College in Bay City. Away from her family and friends for the first time, the clay helped ease the loneliness.

"I was away from home with time on my handa. I get a lot of satisfaction from the results. Working with clay is a multi-step process," Liberman said. "I'm

more secure in three-dimensional than two-dimensional. That's why I like clay."
By using the hand-built technique, Liberman is able to work on one or several pieces at her convenience. "With wet clay, I might work on it at home if I have a few spare hours in the afternoon."

For the last eight years, Liberman has continued to study ceramics at Schoolcraft College in Livonia.
"I never know if I will end with what I preplanned. In pottery, you

For instant gradification, she has found her latest love in raku, a 16th-century Japanese tech-nique. A clay piece still glowing with heat is placed with combus-tible materials, creating particu-lar colors, textures and metallic oxides.
