But I would suggest that the representations could have been avoided by your obtaining an inspection of the premises before your purchase although I cannot tell from the question whether that was part of the agreement.

If you had an attorney representing you, the attorney may have suggested that you confirm the validity of these material representations before you lossed. You apparently are paying the price for buying a very expensive property but perhaps not carefully following through with the details although the seller may well be responsible for your loss.

Our board has hired a management company that has many sites and has promoted itself as a company that can better contract with sub-contractors because of its size. The problem is that we are in the middle of the contract with the management company, but we cannot get them to perform their duties because they are too busy. We talked to the principal of the management company who has all kinds of excuses. How can be extricate ourselves from the contract?

There should be a provision in your management asgreement that allows you to terminate your contract for cause which can be substantiated in regard can be substantiated in regard to the management company's alleged unwillingness or inabili-ty to perform its duties under the management contract. If you have made reasonable efforts to get the management company to discharge its contractual duties, consult with your association at-torney.

You should also know that many management agreements are negotiated or have a clause that provides the association with an "out" of the agreement even if there is not cause. Check your contract; you may have a legal basis to terminate the contract and if necessary, seek damages for the lack of performance by the management company. But it may be more cost effective for you to try to negotiate with the management company to try to resolve the problem or peacefully terminate the agreement as of a specified date.
