It further appearing that after diligent search, inquiry and investigation it cannot be ascertained, and it is not known whether the persons named in said Bill of Complaint as Defendants, or any of them are living or dead, or where he, she or they may reside if living, or whether the right title, interest, claim, lien or possible right has been disposed of by Will; and further, that the present whereabouts of such persons, their heirs-at-law, personal representatives, devisees, legatees and assigns are unknown and the Post Office addresses of none of them can be found or ascertained nor can it be ascertained whether any of them are minors or incompetents.

On motion of John J. Schulte, Jr., attorney for plaintiffs: It is ordered that the appearance of each and all of foregoing defendants be entered in his cause within three months from the date of this Order, and in case of their appearance or the appearance of any of them, that they cause their answer to the Bill of Complaint to be filed, and a copy served upon the attorney for the plaintiff within fifteen days after service upon them, or their attorneys, of a copy of said Bill, and in default thereof that said Bill be taken as confessed by the said defendants who shall fail to comply with the requirements of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the said plaintiffs cause this Order to be published within forty days in the Farmington Enterprise, a newspaper printed, pub-

lished and circulating in said County of Oakland once in each week for six weeks in succession or that plaintiff cause a copy of this Order to be personally served upon each of said defendants herein, at least twenty days before the time prescribed for his her or their appearance.

STATE TO BROADCAST CONDITION OF ROADS DURING THE WINTER

Practically all Michigan state trunk lines are on the snow removal program of the State Highway Department for the winter of 1927-1928, and it is the plan of the department to keep these sections free from snow in so far as possible. Therefore the suspending of traffic on account of snow on the trunk lines should be only temporary. Detailed information on the snow removal program will be broadcast at noon, daily, from Radio Station WKAR at East Lansing, and information concerning those sections of trunk line which are not on the snow removal program can be obtained directly either from the State Highway Department or the county road offices.

USE OF LIGHTER OIL. The use of lighter oil permits easier starting in cold weather. The battery has less resistance to contend with and so can turn over the engine more easily.
