

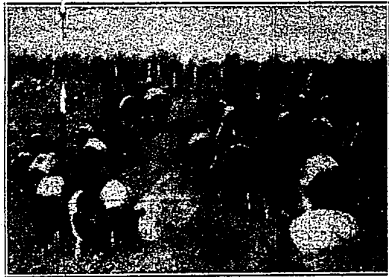

### Relics Recall Early

#### Days of Golden West

A gold pan that was used by Gen. George A. Custer to write the first account of the discovery of gold in the Black Hills is in the possession of the city of Chicago, with a number of other relics on exhibition there. The pan was presented by Custer to Col. W. F. Cody, "Buffalo Bill," who later presented it to Mrs. Michael Russell of Deadwood.

Among other valuable relics in the Russell collection are a highly decorated buckskin coat and a rim-fire revolver that was carried by "Wild Bill" Hickok. The coat was given to "Buffalo Bill" by a squaw on the Pine Ridge reservation, and was worn by the famous scout during the European tour of his Wild West show when he appeared before many kings and queens. Other articles listed are the ox yoke used on the first "bull team" that came to the Black Hills, a buffalo skull picked up on Custer's trail to the hills in 1874, and a husband worn by Sitting Bull.

A "flying flat" is soon to be tested off the coast of England by Capt. F. T. Courtney, one of the most famous test-pilots in England. The machine, a huge superseaplane, will include a kitchen, sleeping accommodation and living rooms. It will take a crew of five to operate, including one man who will act in the triple capacity of cook, houseman and mechanic.
