An accurate method of computing the distance between ships when the helght of the enemy ship is not known is by the use of, the optical range finder. This instrument is installed in the turrets of battleships. It consists of a long tube with optical prisshs. The length of the tube taken as the base of a triangle. The distance is then figured out mathematically. The degree of accuracy depends upon the visibility conditions and the distance can usually be ascertained within a few hundred yards of the exact distance.
