**FARMINGTON GIVEN AN INVITATION TO TAKE PART IN CELEBRATION**

Pontiac will be host to all of Oakland County the nights of August 1 and 2 when the formal opening of Saginaw street, the Dixie highway through Pontiac, will be celebrated with a mammoth County-wide jubilee.

The people of Farmington, thru Mayor Wells D. Butterfield, have been sent an invitation to send a large delegation of officials and private citizens to Pontiac for the affair on either one or both nights.

Every effort is being made to make the jubilee All-County in nature. It will be known as the Pontiac Spirit of Progress and New Pavement Jubilee. Although the thoroughfare is open to traffic now, the sidewalks are still being constructed.

A gala program is being arranged for the two nights, including ceremonies dedicating the new and wider street to the progress of Oakland County through street dances, band and industrial processions, float competitions and pyrotechnic displays.

It is hoped to have every community of the County represented in the reviewing stand. Invitations like that sent Mayor Butterfield, have been sent to every city and village in the County.

Windshield stickers signifying that persons from outside Pontiac are "guests" will be sent to each city and Pontiac police have given assurance that the utmost courtesy will be shown visitors. Pontiac residents will be urged to keep their cars off the streets during the celebration to assure plenty of parking space for the guests.

**ORR ANNOUNCES HIS CANDIDACY FOR PROSECUTOR**

Big Beaver Man Formally Announces He Will Run; Is First Assistant

Norman C. Orr, first assistant county prosecuting attorney, today formally announced his candidacy for the office of prosecutor. Mr. Orr has been an assistant prosecutor since September 14, 1925. He attended grade schools in Bay City and was graduated from high school in Detroit. In February, 1915, he was graduated from the Detroit College of Law and the following September was appointed assistant prosecutor.

Mr. Orr has been married and has three children. In his announcement Mr. Orr says that his record as assistant prosecutor is his platform for the nomination at the September primary election.

"I have done my best at every turn to do my duty for the people," he said. "I have tried to be fair and square with everyone. If nominated for prosecutor and elected, that policy shall continue to be mine."
