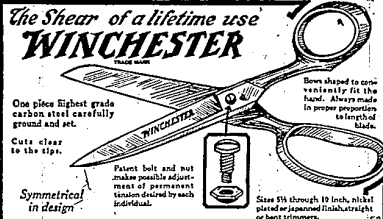

OPPOSITION TO THE LEAVENWORTH DRAIN IS SHOWN

Objectors Claim Proposed System Would Lower Level Of Walled Lake Waters

Some opposition to the construction of the Leavenworth Drain is being manifested by taxpayers of Novi and Commerce Townships. The belief of the objectors is that the building of such a drain will lower the lake level of Walled Lake.

Even if a dam is built they contend, a certain amount of water will seep through the ground and will gradually lower the water. This, it is said, would be a great detriment to the Lake and anything that will lower the level of any lake in Oakland County is understood to be against the policy of the County Board of Supervisors.

The recent lowering of the level of Long Lake and the consequent order of the Board of Supervisors to the County Prosecuting Attorney to start suit, is pointed out as indicating their attitude in the matter and that the Board would be against the Leavenworth Drain if it would lower the lake level at Walled Lake.

The hearing on the project will be held before the members of the Board of Supervisors appointed by the Probate Judge.

There is said to be no denial that the Drain would dry up a large number of acres between Walled Lake and the Twelve-Mile road and make suitable for use a tract of land, which is now of no use and breeds mosquitoes. It is claimed, however, that a lowering of the water in the Lake would be a greater evil than leaving the drain as it now is.

Old residents state that the creek once was "a good, live stream," but that it has become choked with a growth of weeds and grass until the original course has become entirely lost and the overflow of the Lake lies stagnant over a large area, making it a swamp, and that only a small stream of water flows from it. It is also said that a dam would stop the running of fish up the stream in the spring of year with the consequent good spearing. But as spearing of fish has been outlawed in Michigan, this would not affect anyone, it is said.
