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TELLS ABOUT WORLD'S FIRST PNEUMATIC AUTO TIRE, BUILT IN 1895

"The highly developed automatic tire of today," says A. C. Wallbank, local distributor of Michelin Tires, "bears small resemblance to its forbear, the world's first pneumatic automobile tire, introduced by the Michelin Brothers in France, as long ago as 1895."

"That tire was a big affair—over four feet in diameter though little larger in cross-section than a modern motor-cycle tire. It wasn't much to look at and the few car builders of the day were not willing to try it out. So to prove that the tire would actually support a car, the Michelin Brothers built a car for it—and then entered the car in the Paris Bordeaux race of 1895."

"The car was a ramshackle affair—built of a tiny Peugeot motor and a pick-up chassis. A good wind would probably have damaged it. Except for its pneumatic tires, it would surely have been knocked apart by the impact of the road. But, thanks to the pneumatics, it held together. In fact for brief periods it attained the then hair-raising speed of 30 miles an hour."

"It did not win the race, for there were dozens of blowouts on the way, not to mention several fires from short circuits. But nevertheless the event proved that pneumatic tires were practical."

"That was the real beginning of the automotive industry."

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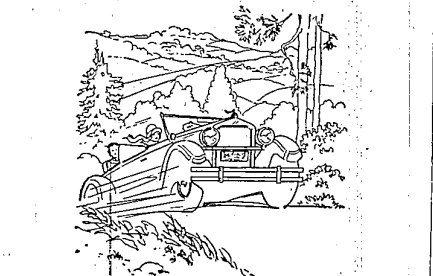
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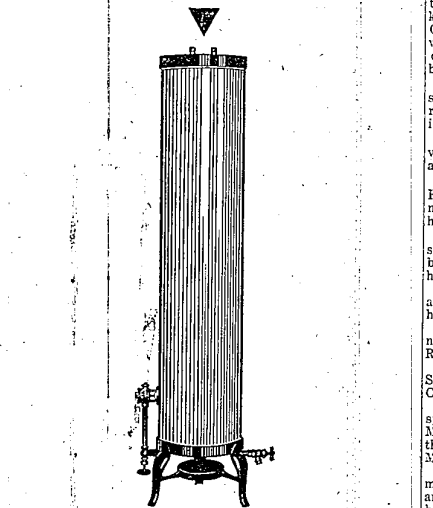

TEMPTING JELLIED DISHES

When the warm days of summer are upon us we will turn to our recipes to find some dishes which will tempt and refresh us.

A jellied dish for salad dessert or for a main dish as an easily prepared in the early part of the day, and placed on ice it is ready at a moment's notice. For aspic jelly we add gelatin to seasoned stock, brown or white, or canned bouillon may be used. The jelly should be well seasoned and stiff enough to hold its shape when turned out.

Jellied Veal and Ham.—Buy a shank of veal with plenty of meat on the bone—about four pounds. Wash and place the shank on to stew in a pot of water for each pound and add one-fourth cupful each of chopped carrots, minced onion and diced celery, a few sprigs of parsley, a bayleaf, one-eighth teaspoonful of thyme, eight peppercorns and two teaspoonfuls of salt. Cook slowly until the meat falls from the bones. Remove the meat from the bones and cool under weight. Strain the liquor through a sieve and cool, remove every bit of fat. Clarify by adding crushed egg shells and slightly beaten whites, boil up, then strain through a cheesecloth. Add a little of the veal broth to a bread pan and allow it to thicken. On this place sliced veal and ham in thin slices. Cover with more broth and cool; repeat until all the broth and meat are used. Chill for several hours and turn from the mold. If the stock seems to lack gelatin add some of the broth—two tablespoonfuls will be sufficient.

Sugarless Iceing.—This is a recipe left from the war, but is as popular as ever: Take a small can of condensed milk, which will be sweet, stir into it enough cream to make a paste of the consistency to spread, adding a bit of powdered sugar if short on cocoa or it is wanted more sweet. Swedish cooks chicken stewed fruit with potato flour and cold. Serve with cream when cold.

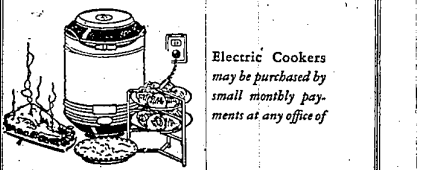
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
