"I believe the new county building should be built in its entirety without cost to the taxpayers of Oakland County. I believe that the old county building at Saginaw and Huron streets will bring to the county treasury, somewhere between a million and a laft dollars, and that if this plan is carried through, both land and the buildings for this new county property can be paid for out of this sale.

"The property in particular that I am advocating is on south Saginaw street where the Pontian Nursery now stands." I feel that with the St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital directly across the street, the new county building on this location would make a beautiful entrance to Pontiac, which as everybody knows, is the county seed. With the hospital on one side of Saginaw street and the county buildings on the other, the approach would have the same beautiful ecect to Pontiac that the Art Museum and the Public Library have to Woodward avenue in Detroit.
