Special meeting of the Commissioners of the City of Farmington held September 13, 1928. Called to order by Mayor Butterfield at 7:40 p. m.

Commissioners present, Staman, Johnson, Hogle, and Bicking.

After discussion it was decided that hereafter all funds collected by the office of justice of the peace shall be turned over to the City Treasurer minus the legal fees.

A re-organization of the fire department was decided upon, with increased membership and compensation.

Regular meeting of the Commissioners of the City of Farmington held September 17, 1928.

Called to order by Mayor Butterfield at 7:37 p. m. Commissioners present: Johnson, Staman, Hogle, and Russell.

A petition was received from residents of Warner avenue asking for a sidewalk from School street north to Mrs. Button's property. Referred to the Sidewalk Commissioners.

Mr. Frank Macomebr appeared before the Commissioners and asked for permission to install an oil tank of 2,000 gallons capacity. Tank will be in the street, three feet underground. Motion made by Johnson, supported by Hogle that permission be given to install it according to Detroit City Code and under the supervision of the Superintendent of Public Works. Carried.

After discussion the matter of opening Macomb street to Quaker road was referred to Street Commissioner Johnson.

Special Fire Commissioner Staman recommended that the members of the Fire Department receive \$2.00 for the first hour in fighting fire and \$1.00 for each additional hour or fraction thereof. Also \$2.00 for practice periods. Motion made by Hogle, seconded by Russell that the recommendation be approved. Carried.

Fire department hours and salary was referred to Russell and Staman for a detailed and definite report.

Matter of grading the hill in Oakwood Cemetery was referred to Commissioner Staman and Supt. Grant.

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
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


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
