 Leonard Ortwin, who has been on a hunting trip, returned Sunday with a deer. His father and brother Clarence remained in the

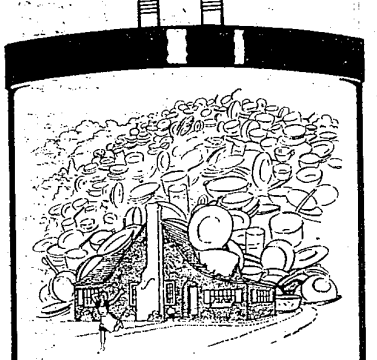
north for a week longer.

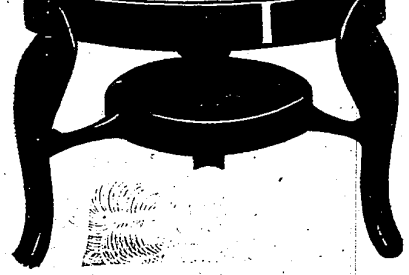

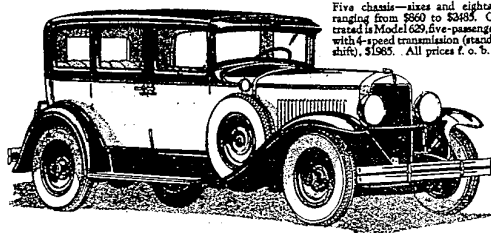
