FARMINGTON POST OF LEGION MAKING MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

Groves-Walker Post Endeavoring To Get Members Signed Up For 1928.

"The American Legion in Farmington has taken a great step forward this year by getting an early start in strengthening the organization in membership for the busiest year's work in our history," Harley A. Schroeder, commander of Groves-Walker Post, No. 346, says in an appeal to Legionnaires who have not renewed their 1928 membership to do so at once.

"American Legion Week, which started with the Armistice Day address of the National Commander, Paul V. McNutt, over the radio, a program in which President Coolidge took part, has inspired the Legionnaires throughout the country to carry through to success the most important program of activities yet planned by the Legion.

"Farmington is coming up to expectations in getting the membership signed up for another year. It is an individual responsibility of every Legionnaire to help this movement going.

"The first major objective is to increase the service to the disabled. Thousands of veterans, many of them in our own communities, should be receiving the help that a grateful government has decreed they should receive. Too much time elapses in many cases, due chiefly to the difficulty of connecting a man's illness with his war service. As time increases this will be all the more difficult.

"The Legion also demands speedier justice for the needy child of the veteran who gave his life or his health, in the service of his country. The Children's Bill at Otter Lake is our tribute to them.

"Third, is the Americanism work, community service, the Junior Baseball program next Summer, and the promotion of good citizenship through education.

"National defense is ever foremost in the Legion's activities, and the Universal Draft bill that would take profit out of war must be passed by Congress.

"To do these things, the Legion must maintain in 1929 the membership roll of 1928. By renewing his membership this early the veteran subscribes to this program. In doing so he is serving his country in peace time with the same loyalty that he gave in time of war. By not subscribing, he is shirking a responsibility only himself can answer for.
