Mrs. A. Condit and family of Macon sent Thanksgiving at the home of A. C. Walling.

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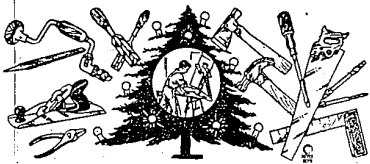

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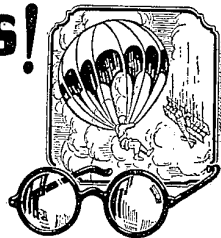

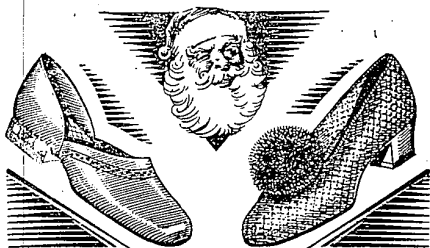
