OU vice-presidential slate wiped clean

Two more Oakland University vice presidents have announced plans to leave the school.

After the end of January 1994, when senior vice president John DeCarlo and vice president of student affairs Wilma Ray-Bledsoe leave OU, not one vice president will be left who was present when university President Sandra Packard took over in June 1992.

Other high OU officials who have left between then and now are Keith Kleckner, former vice president for academic affairs; Robert McGarry, former vice

president for finance and administration; and Frank Cardimon, who was acting vice president of development and alumni affairs.

Of the latest imminent departures, DeCarlo, 66, said he is retiring effective Jan. 31, 1994, while Ray-Bledsoe, 66, is resigning for personal reasons, effective Jan. 7, 1994. "I will continue to support OU as my time and resources permit," she said.

Ray-Bledsoe has been with OU since 1973 when she hired in as assistant to the president and director of urban affairs. DeCarlo

was hired in 1969 as assistant chancellor for the performing arts. In recent years, DeCarlo has been OU's general counsel and secretary to the board of trustees.

"Wilma and John have meant

so much to the building of this university," Packard said. "I know the entire community joins with me in extending our good wishes and our thanks for their many contributions to this institution."
