

Hawks win close meet over Falcons

Farmington Hills Harrison's Jenny Domino won two events and anchored the last relay victory Thursday as the Hawks defeated visiting Farmington 95-91 in a Western Lakes Activities Association girls swimming meet.

Domino won the 200-yard individual medley with a personal best time of 2:29.0 and the 500 freestyle with another personal best (5:49.3).

Domino saved her best for last, however, as the two teams were tied at 87 heading into the final event — the 400 freestyle relay.

Margo Ward, Patty Dizon, Dana Dizon and Domino finished ahead of Farmington at 4:12.7 to win the meet.

Domino's final 100-yard push gave the Hawks the win.

"Jenny practices harder than anybody I've got, and it's nice for her to pull it off; she deserves it," Harrison coach Mark Holdridge said. "It's nice to have a meet where she's so dominating."

The Hawks built a big lead early after individual wins by Julie Cripps, 200 freestyle (2:17.1); Kristy Dizon, 50 freestyle (26.72); Kim Fisher, diving (190.4); and Dana Dizon, breaststroke (1:17.1).

The Hawks also got a win in the 200 medley relay from Paul-

na Petrovic, Dana Dizon, Nicole Lozon and Patty Dizon in 2:13.1.

Farmington's wins came from Anne Marie Scania, butterfly (1:08.9); Jill Benivenga, 100 freestyle (1:02.2); and Katie Seed, backstroke (1:12.3).

The 200 freestyle relay team of Benivenga, Colleen Hoy, Scania and Kerri Stoll also won in 1:59.4.

NORTH 53, N'VILLE 40: Sherri Richardson won two events and assisted in two relay victories Thursday as North Farmington improved to 4-0 in dual meets.

"We had an outstanding team effort," North coach Pat Duthie said. "There were a lot of close swims and we won our share."

Richardson won the 200 and 500 freestyle races with times of 2:05.33 and 5:41.18.

Sherri and Lisa Richardson teamed with Amy Finkel and Stephanie Cohen to win the 200 freestyle relay (1:47.09), Shannon O'Brien and Becky Ashburn to win the 400 (3:56.03).

Finkel also had two firsts in the 50 and 100 freestyle with 26.4 and 58.2 times. O'Brien won the individual medley in 2:22.14.

The Raiders also had a first in diving from Mandy Terrell, who had 255.10 points.

Naik (18:46) took ninth and 10th, respectively, to clinch the meet for North. Brian Kriston and Andrew Wantuck took 11th and 12th for the Raiders in 18:46 and 18:59, respectively.

"The first three runners looked real good and also the fourth through eighth," North coach Paul Welch said. "The times are starting to come down and we needed that in a big way."
