Hoeglund served family, city

Whether it was competing as an athlete, being a mother to three children or as deputy treasurer for the city of Farmington, family and friends say Annabelle Hoeglund gave that extra effort.

Hoeglund died Friday, Oct. 7, after a prolonged battle with cancer. She was 69.

She is survived by her husband of 46 years, Milton Hoeglund; their three children, Lorraine Santo, Edward Hoeglund and Pamela Huber; and five grandchildren.

She's also survived by a sister, Esther Kmetz of Canton, Ohio, and two brothers, Ed Hupert of Au Gres, Mich., and Leo Hupert of Grand Junction, Colo.

Family members say she never missed an occasion to be with her children or grandchildren, including birthdays, holidays, anniversaries and school functions.

A longtime Farmington area resident, she went to Bond School, she graduated from Farmington High in 1942 where she played both junior varsity and varsity girls basketball.

Milton was her date for the senior prom where she was named honor queen.

She later joined the U.S. Navy during the height of World War II in 1944 and was stationed in Cleveland, Ohio, in the records bureau. She kept corresponding with Milton, who was also in the Navy and stationed overseas.

They were married March 29, 1947. They moved into a home on Hawthorne where they have lived for all 46 years of their marriage.

"We were just enjoying our retirement together," Milton Hoeglund said. "She took up golf after she retired. She used to be a good bowler, too."

After the war, Hoeglund worked with children for Farmington

parks and recreation. Her favorite job was as deputy treasurer for the city of Farmington where she worked for 20 years.

Hoeglund was there when current Farmington city clerk Patsy Cantrell started as treasurer.

"She was an exceptional lady who was always interested in providing good services to the city and to the residents, especially to senior citizens," Cantrell said. "Many times she would deliver forms to their homes they needed to complete. . . . She was very willing to go that extra step."

Hoeglund retired in 1987. She was also a lifetime member of Eastern Star and the American Legion where she was a past commander.

Services are 11 a.m. today at First United Methodist Church, Farmington. Burial is at Oakland Hills Memorial Gardens.
