
Man faces bribery charge

A Farmington Hills man is one of three former work-release inmetes charged in a political corruption case involving six former or current Oakland County Sheriffa deputies and two Rochester Hills city officials.

William Jerold Markowitz was arraigned before 51st District Court magistrate John McGrath Oct. 5 for bribery of a public offi-cial, a four-year felony, Markowitz will be arraigned Nov. 2 in Waterford before District Judge Robert

Markowitz, along with Earl Jerome Watkins, of Bloomfield Hills and Joseph Bergin of Bloomfield Township, is charged with bribing former Sgt. James Couttu, who also faces charges in the case.




