# Students master English

At a time when the quality of American education is questioned, some Clarenceville high school students show English skills above the national norm.

A recent survey showed that local gifted students scored one point higher than the national average in language skills when taking the advanced placement portion of the American Collegiate Test.

Several years ago Clarenceville instituted the Motivational English for the Gifted and Accelerated (MEGA), a language arts program for students who showed above-average ability on tests.

The program serves students in the seventh through the 12th

grades. Random samples of MEGA graduates now in college, showed their English grades were consistently above average.

Many of Clarenceville's graduates placed out or advanced past college freshmen English courses and were moved to sophomore level classes.

Two Clarenceville students last year scored well enough on the advanced placement test to skip first-year college English.

The high school yearbook has received a variety of national awards, and in 1988 three seniors had writings reprinted in the Taylor Publishing Company's magazine for student writing. The American Yearbook Company has

awarded the yearbook staff a plaque for meeting deadlines for the past five years.

Many Clarenceville students have received awards for creative writing as well. Ninth-grader Mike Dunklee took honors in the annual Detroit Free Press writing contest.

In five years, advanced English classes at Clarenceville have doubled and sometimes tripled enrollment.

"This program offers unique and challenging opportunities for learning," said Clarenceville High principal David Simowski.

"I'm glad I took the advanced program," said Katy Grant, a 1993 graduate. "I feel I have an edge in college."


