

CC loses division title to DeLaSalle

Redford Catholic Central pushed and pushed. The edge was just not there.

Consequently the Shamrocks fell, losing to host Warren DeLaSalle 2-1 in a boys soccer match Saturday that clinched the Catholic League Central Division for the Pilots.

CC (10-3-3 overall, 5-1-1 division) will play either Madison Heights Bishop Foley or Monroe Catholic Central Wednesday in the first round of the Catholic League playoffs.

The Shamrocks needed a win against the Pilots (11-2-2 overall and 7-0-1 division) Saturday; a tie would not do.

So, when sophomore Chris Kennedy lobbed in the tying goal in the 61st minute, the job was far from finished. CC continued to press and, later, paid for it.

Fleet-footed senior forward Ken Perlin exploited the Shamrock defense, slotting in the game winner with four minutes left.

"We pushed up and we were susceptible at the back," said CC coach Phil LaJoy. "We decided to go for it."

CC dominated the second half and a good portion of the first. The team received three consecutive corner kicks within the first five minutes and controlled play at midfield.

But when DeLaSalle's freshman midfielder Pat Mahoney

broke in to score the first goal in the 15th minute, the wrench tightened the collective lugnut on CC's attack. The Shamrocks finished the first half playing tentatively, down 1-0.

"We were a little flat in the beginning," LaJoy said. "I thought we controlled the second half."

That was clear. Senior forward Matt Kopymeyer acted as a Pilot defender, Valaj continued to create chances down the right flank. Such urgency earned CC a multitude of corner kicks, which couldn't be converted despite the rainy conditions.

Another cross, this one skimming past a Pilot defender, found its way to Kennedy. The goalkeeper came out as CC's sophomore midfielder lofted a soft shot into the back of the net.

Senior defender Trevor Austin followed with the defensive play of a Pilot defender, finding forwards were lingering at midfield, anticipating a break.

Perlin was sent on his way and was bearing down on CC goalkeeper Mike Kokozka. Austin raced back and removed the ball with a crunching slide tackle. Austin injured his foot and left the match.

A few minutes later, Perlin was sent on his way again. This time, though, he converted.

North Farmington moved a step closer to winning its first Lakes Division title in girls cross country and having its first undefeated dual-meet season Thursday.

The Raiders edged Plymouth Salem 20-23 at Oak Bluffs Elementary School and improved to 4-0 in the division and 8-0 overall.

"I figured Salem would be our toughest dual meet, and the girls rose to the occasion," North coach Bill Pinnell said.

Of the top five runners were 53 seconds apart and the top seven 1:20, so from top to bottom we had an outstanding team race."

The Raiders can win the division and achieve the undefeated season Tuesday by beating Westland Glenn at Oakland Community College. Salem had the individual

North put its fourth and fifth runners in front of Salem's fifth to clinch the win.

Becky Naglik was eighth (21:14) and Alicia Crossland ninth (21:16).

Six of the seven ran personal best times for North. Brenner was just two seconds off her previous best, according to Pinnell. Elaine Wolff placed 10th (21:40) and Nora Curiel 13th (21:49).

Salem's Stacy Moore was fifth (20:52), Kelly Stankov sixth (20:57), Emily Farrell seventh

(21:03) and Kathy Jost 10th (21:28).

The Hawks jumped to a 10-2 lead, but the Mustangs went on an 11-0 run. Harrison was able to reclaim the lead at halftime, 23-18.

The halftime show featured a presentation to eight Hawks who have excelled in the classroom, and that seemed to fire up Erin LaCrosse, who made three triples and led in assists, the third and scored all 12 of her points in the quarter.
