Hills man sentenced for fraud

Two Oakland County men last week received prison terms and a Farmington Hills resident received a lesser sentence on fraud charges involving a former Southfield computer trade school. Timothy Weiswasser, 33, of West Bloomfield, former vice president of Com-Tech Computer Training Institute Inc. received a nine-month prison term after pleading guilty in U.S. District Court to obstructing a federal audit of the school as well as using federal aid for his own benefit and failing to refund aid awarded students who did not complete their courses also extracted to prove

courses.

He was also ordered to pay \$363,141 in restitution to the U.S. Department of Education.

His father, Theodore Weiswasser, 56, of Bloomfield Hills, an official of the school, received a 16-month prison term and was ordered to pay a similar amount in restitution after pleading guilty to missapply federal financial aid.

Former Com-Tech president Douglas Cash, 47, of Farmington Hills was sentenced to 90 days at a halfway house and ordered to repay \$85,000 to the federal education department after also pleading guilty to similar fraud and conspiracy charges.

Timothy Weiswasser was also sentenced to three months in a halfway house to be served after completing his prison term. All

three men were sentenced to five years' probation after completing their prison and halfway-house terms.

Com-Tech itself was ordered to repay \$3 million to the federal government for conspiring with the Detroit Engineering Institute to defraud the government of federal aid received between 1988 and 89.

The institute was closed by the

and 89.

The institute was closed by the Michigan Department of Education after losing its accreditation in 1980. Com-Tech ceased operations that same year.

The government charged Com-Tech received the federal grant money by illegally applying under the lastitute's name and federal code number.

3 men arrested in car break-ins

Three Detroit men were arrested and are expected to be charged in connection with a series of car break-ins at Jamestown Apartments early Friday morning.

The three were arrested on charges of attempted auto theft, larceny from a whitele and breaking and entering in connection with break-ins of three cars parked inside apartment garages. They were arrested in a joint of fort by Farmington and Farmington Hills police.

"We've had a couple of incidents there where someone was breaking into garages and then went through the cars," said Farmington director of public safety Gary Goss, "This is the same M.O."
Shortly after 3 a.m., police received a cell from a newspaper delivery man who had seen two men running from a garage in the apartments.

rarmington Hills police stopped a 1986 Buick Century oc-

cupied by three men near where one of the break-ins took place. Pliers, wrench tools and a flash-light were found in a jacket con-fiscated from the car.

Also found was a Delco Elec-tronic car phone, similar to one faken from one of of the vehicles that was broken into.

Pry marks were found on a garage door. Perpetrators are be-lieved to have entered through a hallway connected to the garages.

Charges added in subleasing scam case

New charges have been brought against two men already facing 30 counts each in connection with an auto subleasing scam in which several people were bilked out of money.

The preliminary examination scheduled for Oct. 18 of Charles Anthony, 45, of Harrison Township and James Kluza, 34, of Warren, has been adjourned until

Nov. 12.
Each faces charges of larceny by conversion over \$100 (a flveyear felony), embezzlement over \$100 (a 10-year felony) and conspiracy to commit a larceny over \$100 (a five-year felony).
The men were arrested in August. They ran Universal Automotive on Grand River in Farmington Hills.

Anthony, who has used aliases in Michigan, Missouri, Illinois and California, is free on \$2,500 band from the state of Illinois where he faces similar charges.
