

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**■ FIRES**

Farmington Hills firefighters from Station 4 are investigating a blown up mail box on Lancaster in Farmington Hills Oct. 23. The fire extinguished itself and the damage was estimated at \$25.

Firefighters from Station 1 put out a Dumpster fire in the parking lot of Tom Holzer Ford on 10 Mile at 8:30 a.m. Oct. 28. Some cardboard had caught fire. Workers from Holzer were trying to put out the fire with a garden hose when firefighters arrived to extinguish the fire. There was no damage to the building, cars or Dumpster.

Upon arrival at the Holiday Inn on 10 Mile in Farmington Hills, firefighters from Station 1 investigated a smoke scare and found a purse-sized container of pepper gas in one of the rooms. The room's occupants denied knowledge of the gas. The room was ventilated and Hills police are investigating the incident.

A damaged meter led to a gas leak at Oakland Community College on Orchard Lake Road at 11:30 p.m. Oct. 31. The gas lines were shut down until Consumers Power personnel arrived.

Firefighters from Station 2 responded to a gas leak Oct. 28 at a residence on Westmont in Farmington Hills. The homeowner told firefighters he had been digging a trench by hand when he severed a natural gas line.

**■ BREAK-IN**

After the man left, the clerk ran to the pharmacy in the rear of the store to report the robbery.

**Hills man faces charges**

A Farmington Hills man who was wanted for fleeing and eluding now faces assault, felony firearms and malicious destruction of property charges stemming from his arrest.

Michigan State Police Trooper Phil Vannetto of the Northville post tried to arrest Joseph Ziegler, 29, Oct. 29 at 12 Mile and Novi roads in Novi on a felony warrant.

Vannetto handcuffed Ziegler and was leaning into his cruiser to call in on the radio. The suspect reached into the officer's holster and tried to take his service revolver. Vannetto testified at Ziegler's arraignment. The officer got the gun back and secured his prisoner.

Lt. Stephen Kraff said Ziegler is also accused of damaging a heater at the holding cell in 52nd District Court in Walled Lake, where he was arraigned. In addition to the fleeing and eluding charge, Ziegler faces assault, felony firearms and malicious destruction of property charges.

He posted a \$15,000 bond on the assault charge and also a \$25,000 bond on the fleeing and eluding charge. Kraff said Ziegler's preliminary exam is scheduled for Nov. 10 in 52nd District Court.
