

**POLICE/FIRE CALLS**

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

**ARMED ROBBERY**  
Two employees said a male wearing a bandanna made away with \$100 in cash and a gold necklace in an armed robbery at Little Caesars on Grand River in Farmington Nov. 7. According to the employees, the assailant hopped over the counter and made one of them lie on the floor while the other was led off to a refrigerated area. Neither employee said they saw a weapon, but noticed a bulge in the pocket of the robber's hooded sweatshirt that looked like it could be a gun. He took cash from the register and placed it into a pouch. He led both employees back to the refrigerator area before leaving. They described the man as black between 5-foot-11 and 6-foot-2 and weighing 135 pounds. Both em-

**ARSON**  
A fire was set in a women's bathroom at Harrison High School on 12 Mile in Farmington Hills Nov. 4. There were no injuries and the sprinkling system put out the fire that started at about 3:15 p.m., after most students had left the building. The walls were blackened and a plastic towel dispenser melted from the heat.  
Farmington Hills police arrested two 11-year-old Farmington Hills children for using matches and an aerosol can of fabric protector to light a fire behind a stairwell at the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill Nov. 5.  
**AUTO THEFT**  
A blue 1992 Ford Tempo was rented and not returned to Enterprise Rent A Car on Drake in

Farmington Hills between Oct. 2 and Nov. 5 by a 33-year-old Detroit woman. The car had been due back by Oct. 13.  
**FOUND PROPERTY**  
An inscribed handstone was found next to a Dumpster at Beaver Industries on Drake in Farmington Hills Nov. 5. The stone was cleaned up and the inscription revealed. It says "Sarah Davis Leale 1905-1938." Hills police do not know what cemetery the stone came from.  
**VANDALISM**  
A BB gun was used to shoot the front picture window of a residence on Bernardino in Farmington Hills between Oct. 31 and Nov. 6, causing \$250 in damage. The windshield and rear window of a white 1992 Chevy Caprice Classic parked on Lakeland in Farmington Hills Oct. 31 was smashed, causing \$569.66 in damage.

An antenna was bent and the passenger side of a white 1993 Pontiac parked at the Green Hill Apartments on Green Hill in Farmington Hills was scratched Nov. 2-3, resulting in \$200 in damage.  
The passenger side of a blue 1987 Mercury Sable parked on Bunker Hill in Farmington Hills was scratched Nov. 5-6, causing \$300 in damage.  
Two tires were slashed on a white 1989 Dodge shadow and two tires were slashed on a brown 1989 Ford Tempo, both parked at a residence on Chesterbrook in Farmington Hills Nov. 6, causing a total of \$240 in damage.  
A pickup truck or four-by-four drove over a lawn and hill area at Delta Engineering on Interchange in Farmington Hills Nov. 6-8, causing \$300 in damage.  
A window was broken at a residence on Jacksonville in Farmington Hills Nov. 9, causing \$400 in damage.

**ASSAULT**  
A 42-year-old Farmington Hills man was reported he was attacked by a man he described as black, about 25, 6 feet, 200 pounds, wearing a beige coat and dark knit cap after he had paid for gas and was walking out of Minne Sunoco on Grand River Nov. 6. The victim said he did not know the man who punched him several times.  
A 21-year-old Farmington Hills man who was driving a van with a 21-year-old Walled Lake man in the passenger seat said a black woman, 25-35, heavy set with a violet shirt or jacket passed him in a silver VW Jetta on northbound Old Timber in Farmington Hills Nov. 6 at about 1:20 p.m. When the two vehicles came to a stop the woman pointed a black pistol at the driver who then fled the scene.  
An 18-year-old Farmington Hills man was attacked by six 10- to 17-year-old gang members as he was walking along Rensselaer in Farmington Hills Nov. 7. He
