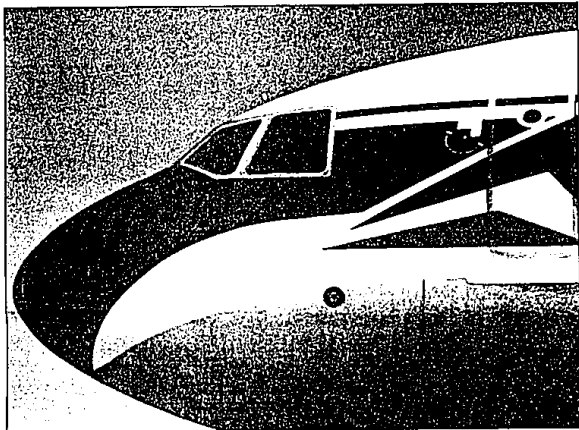

## POLICE/FIRE CALLS

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police incidents, fire calls and court cases reported during the past week.

### AUTO THEFT

An attempt to steal a silver 1991 Ford Mustang from Kitts Industrial Tools on Eight Mile in Farmington Hills Nov. 9 resulted in damage to the passenger door lock. A man described as black, age 20, 5-foot-6, 165 pounds, wearing a dark green down jacket, was seen crouching by the car when the alarm went off. The car's owner found the lock dented.

### FIRES

Farmington Public Safety Department officers put out a blaze Nov. 12 that caused extensive damage to the interior of an 11-story office building on Farmington and Orchard. Firefighters responded at 3:53 a.m. after a newspaper carrier called and said he had seen smoke coming from the back of the building. A crew of 15 people put out the blaze, which caused an estimated \$25,000 damage. The cause of the fire was unknown in preliminary reports.

Farmington Hills firefighters from station 1 responded to reports of smoke coming from exhaust ducts at the Entre Computer Center on Interchange at about noon Nov. 8. A broken belt and melted wiring was found and the gas power was shut off to the heating unit.

Farmington Hills firefighters from station 4 investigated a delayed report of a fire of a newspaper box at a residence on Wayburn West in Farmington Hills Nov. 5. The melted remains of the box were found at the base of the mounting pole. There were no witnesses to the fire, but a neighbor told firefighters about two juveniles on Rollerblades who were in the area. The resident asked them to inform the fire department. They said they would but didn't, and then left the scene.

Station 4 firefighters also responded to a residence on Glenarden in Farmington Hills where a newspaper box had been jammed into a mail box and set on fire at about 11:21 Nov. 5.

Station 4 firefighters also found a burned newspaper box at a residence on Ardmore in Farmington Hills at about 11:49 Nov. 5.

### VANDALISM

The windshield was smashed on a 1990 silver Mercury Sable on Shadow Glen in Farmington Hills Nov. 10, causing \$200 in damage.

A car drove over a lawn, striking an eight-foot electric lamp post at a residence on Tuck and causing \$200 in damage.

A white 1990 Nissan and a 1993 BMW parked at Heritage Hills in Farmington Hills Nov. 7 were keyed, causing \$1,200 in damage to the Nissan and \$600 in damage to the BMW.

An automatic garage door was closed on a black 1993 Ford Taurus as it was backing out of a garage on Congress in Farmington Hills Nov. 10, causing \$800 in damage.

### BREAK-INS

The passenger side plastic window was cut on a white 1990 Jeep parked on Woodhill in Farmington Hills, causing \$100 in damage and a \$404 Sony AM/FM stereo CD player and 38 CDs (\$450) were stolen Nov. 10.

The driver's window of a blue 1987 Pontiac Firebird parked on Industrial Park in Farmington Hills was broken, causing \$50 in damage and an AM/FM cassette stereo (\$400) was stolen Nov. 10.

An Alpine in-dash stereo system (\$250) was stolen from a black Suzuki Samurai parked at American Vacation on Northwestern Highway Nov. 11. The break-in caused \$100 in damage to the driver's door lock.

### FRAUD

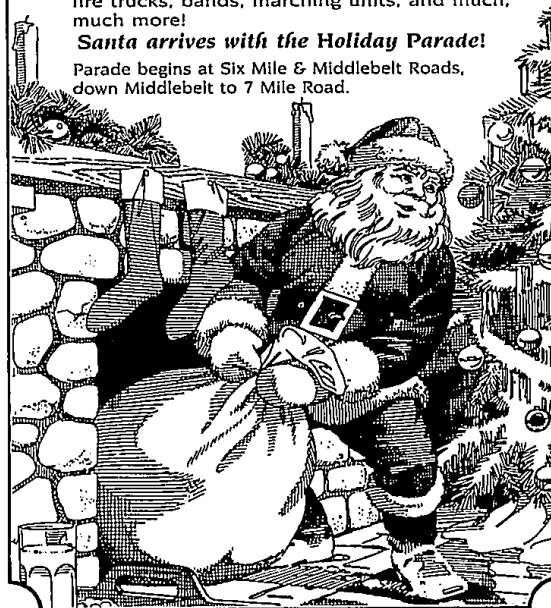
