"They gave me a list of chemicals that are known to cause aplastic onemia and told me to stay away from those," he said. "Sometimes it's not easy when you want tog fill up your car with gas. I wear rubber gloves when I do that. And there are still things I can't do like go to shopping malls during peak hours when there are a lot of people or cut the lawn because of the bacteria that grows on the grass."
