The grassroots support that was the center's fortification in the past is fading, Degregorio said. While the current 180-member Volunteer Guild is treasured and performs necessary tasks at the center, more and different people are needed to help. The times open to volunteers are varied, too, including days, evenings and weekends, Degregorio said.

For instance, the ailing heating system needs replacing, which was obvious on a recent November morning when some rooms were chilly and others were stifling hot.
