CITY OF FARMINGTON
SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. C-606-93

The City of Farmington ordains:

Chapter 35, Section 35-203, Commercial Vehicle Storage, is hereby amended to read as follows:
Requires that commercial vehicles parked or stored in parking lots open to the public shall be parked in spaces designated by site plans. Regulates the parking of commercial vehicles in parking lots site planned prior to this ordinance. States that the minimum parking requirements required as part of any site plan be maintained.

Section 35-223, Lot Layout, Construction and Maintenance, is hereby amended by adding a new subsection (14) which shall read as follows:
Delegates authority to the Planning Commission to designate number and location of commercial vehicle parking spaces in new or redesigned parking lots requiring site plans.

SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. C-607-93

The City of Farmington ordains:

Chapter 25-8, Signs, by adding new subsection (1)(f), Permits Required, is hereby amended as follows:
Requires that commercial vehicles with signs be parked in locations other than adjacent to roadway right-of-ways unless no other parking spaces are available.

"That's what I was shooting for — to keep it even and consistent. (His skating performance) was as good as any had gone in practice."

Findlay had two things working in his favor going into his fourth world championships. One was veteran coach Bud Patton, who has coached other champions.

"I think I was very well-prepared, well-practiced and extremely well-coached — and that helped my confidence," Findlay said.

"He's the one who has done everything to get me to this point and was instrumental in my development as a skater. There's no way I could ever think about accomplishing it without what he's done for me."

The other positive factor was Findlay's own experience from the previous world events, specifically the format that is used for compe-

tion. "Having been through it, I knew what to expect," he said. "When I was getting ready to go to my first worlds, people were telling me how important it was to be down and do well the first year."

"I was the new kid on the block and you have to show them who you are." I really built upon that each year. By the third time, it was old hat. I knew where to go and when to go."

Findlay, who was in Las Vegas last weekend to perform a demonstration for judges and coaches at the Imperial Palace Hotel, plans to take a break until January. "That's when I start again and try to do it all over again," he said of his plans to attempt a repeat as world champion next year. "It would be nice to experience it all over again."

COUNCIL MEMBERS ABSENT: None.

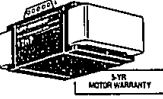

Public Hearing: Principal Shopping District Hearing to Confirm Special Assessment Roll 93-50.

Presentations: Donn Wolf, Oakland County Commissioner, representing his employer, Detroit Edison, presented a \$500.00 check to Nanette Reid for the 125th Anniversary sculpture.

Minutes of other boards and commissions were received and filed.

Council approved funding for one boy from Farmington High School to attend Michigan State University for the 1994 Boys State Program, and appointed Councilperson Bush as a contact person.

Council adopted the Principal Shopping District Resolution No. 5 confirming Special Assessment Roll 93-50.

Council authorized Change Order No. 11 of \$14,452.41, and final payment No. 21 in the amount of \$36,049.28 to Dan's Excavating, Inc. for work completed on the Sewer Improvement Project.

Council authorized payment in the amount of \$1,843.59 to Black & Veatch for the project performance certification program.

Council adopted a resolution to indemnify the City of Blackman from liability created by City activities on the State trunkline right-of-way and approved securing of permits to work within the State trunkline right-of-way.

Council authorized the purchase of a 1994 Ford Crown Victoria administrative vehicle.

Council authorized the contract of \$6,403.00 to Sullivan-Widmer for repairs to the museum roof.

Council scheduled a study session on December 20, 1993 at 7:00 p.m.

Council appointed Shirley Smith to the Farmington Board of Review for a 3-year term expiring in December of 1996.
