Superintendent choice expected Tuesday night

The Farmington Board of Education is expected to name a new superintendent of schools during a special meeting beginning at 8 p.m. Towards, Dec. 14, at the Lewis Schulman Administration Building, 23600 Shiawassec Road, Farmington.

The appointment is the only item of substance on the agenda of the meeting which will not be cablecast.

Two southeast Michigan school superintendents are in the running for the position. They are Thomas Shorkey of the East Chrima Schools near Marine City and C. Robert Maxifold of the Berkley Schools.

The winner will replace Michael Flangan, who resigned to head up the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency, Both Maxifold and Shorkey are from out-of-formula (very little state aid) districts, and easy refrom cut-of-formula (very little state aid) districts, and can worked his way up through his respective school system.

Maxifold has been superintendent of Berkley aince 1988. With the exception of a six-year slint as

principal of Clawson High, he has been with the Berkley District since 1973.

From 1974 to present, Shorkey has served as teacher, assistant principal, assistant superintendent and superintendent in the East China District. He's been school chief since 1989.

The Farmington Board of Education last week named Clifford Scherer, who retired about 10 years ago from the superintendency of the Huron Valley Schools, as interim superintendent.

Scherer will serve until Maxfield or Scherer can take over.
