KETERING 68, HARRISON 55: You don't have to be a basketball guru to figure out what happened to Farmington Harrison at Waterford Kettering. Just look at the stat sheet:

Harrison hit just 14 of 30 free throws and 19 of 49 shots from the floor, including at least 11 layups and put-backs.

"We got the shots we wanted," said Coach Mike Teachman. "If we would have made them, we would have won."

The Hawks were within five late in the final quarter.
