Judge hangs up on call box case

When investigators questioned Oakland County Sheriff John Nichols about the theft of two Detroit call boxes, they asked him what he thought they were worth. "Probably not a hell of lot," the sheriff replied.

On Wednesday, a Rochester Hills judge agreed with him.
A pair of criminal charges were dismissed in 52-3 bistrict Court against deputy Mike Schmitzerle, who was accused of stealing the two Detroit call boxes sometime in 1991.

The prosecutor's office failed to prove the call boxes were worth anything, or even if they were actually stolen, Judge James Sheeby said in dismissing the charges.

"No evidence has been presented, other than assumptions, that
the defendant actually stole the
bixes and took them to Oakland
County," Sheehy said.
One of the boxes was given to

Nichols in November 191 as a birthday gift, The other ended up in the office of Gerard Carlin, the former commander of the Rockester Hills substation.

Schmitzerle was accused of stealing the two boxes from the Southfield Freeway. Detroit police stopped using them in the mid 1970s, but never bothered taking them down.

Schmitzerle was charged with larceny over \$100, and with receiving and concealing stolen goods, both 5-year felonics.

An inventory book listed the boxes at \$348 apiece, but Sheeby said the book value was inadmissible because the hoxes were never manufactured as a product of Board Sheet Remult as distributor.

Robert Breault, a distributor for the call boxes, testified Wednesday that the last time be sold one was in 1937 to n firm in Massachusetts.
Also taking the stand was Nichols, who guessed there are around 1,200 call boxes still in

Detroit. Nichols was a police offi-cer in Detroit for 32 years, until 1973. Nichols said Carlin gave him the box for a birthday gift in 1991. The sheriff said he turned it right aver to investigators when he heard it was stolen.

Asked why he wanted it, Ni-chols said, "It was a question of nostalgia more than anything else."

Assistant prosecutor Greg Townsend said he plans to imme-diately appeal the dismissal.






